Fingering recruits

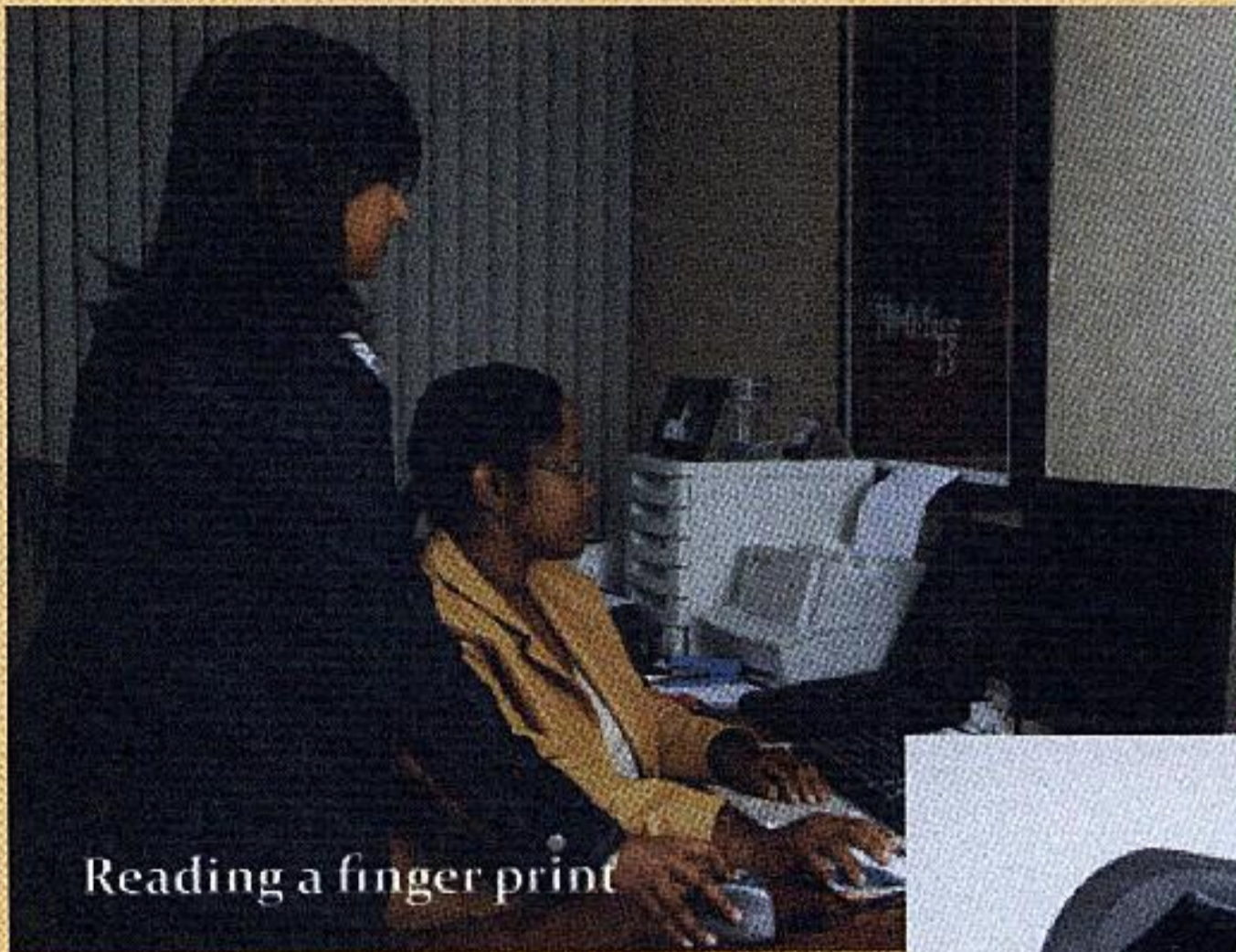

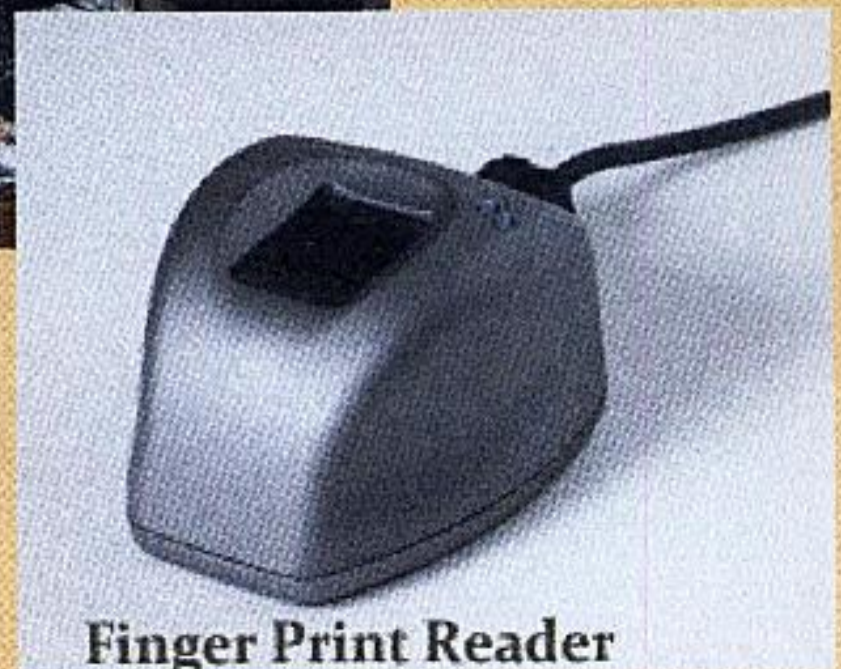
